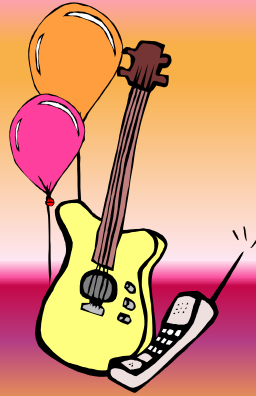




Boogie with Jeff "Boogie" Schultz
